



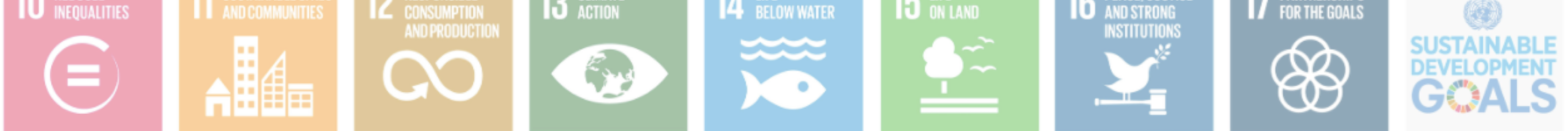

Key features

1. Implementing the “Geneva Trialogue spirit”

- Academic scholars providing the basis of knowledge on SD, intercultural issues, global challenges, data mining and processing, etc.
- Strong involvement of actors coming from IGOs and global NGOs, regional/national administrations, and the private sector



Key features

2. Combining various forms of teaching

- Academic teaching
- Learning-by-doing : 4 workshops where students deal with practical issues and challenges
- Conference cycles
- Field works in Europe, Middle East, USA and China
- Internships



Key features

3. Curriculum

1 year in Geneva, 1 year in Beijing or Shenzhen

3 specializations:

- Sustainable human development (with UNDP, UNEP, UNESCO, etc.)
 - Standards, Governance and Sustainability (mainly with ISO and ILO)
- Sustainable cities and territories (with UNDP, WWF, etc.)
